

Examining current policies, assessing gaps, and recommending new policies as needed









# State assessments are an important component of Chariho's Comprehensive Assessment System

#### They provide:

- Information to measure the effectiveness of our curriculum and programs.
- Identify areas where students may need extra support.
- Provide students and parents information about an individual student's progress.
- For students at the HS level, a qualifying score may meet one of Chariho's Reading and/or mathematics standardized assessments graduation requirements, more information can be found on the district's <u>Academic Requirements for High School</u> <u>Graduation Policy</u>.

# **Participation**

- The Rhode Island Department of Education requires that all students participate in the required state tests in-person, in the school building. There are no remote options for state testing.
- Chariho continues to follow all recommended guidelines and protocols set forth by the RI Department of Health to ensure the safety of our children.
